From the Pastor

We will worship via Zoom this coming Sunday in order to be good stewards of ourselves and the community. Instructions are below. I invite each worship participant to **be cozy and comfortable** and to **bring at least one piece of paper and a writing/drawing utensil such as a pen, pencil, marker, crayon, etc.** Worshiping online isn't the same as being in person; however, Sunday's service was intended to be a bit non-traditional and experiential, and Zoom is a great venue for it.

It's been a while since we've worshiped in virtual community. A few quick reminders:

- Test your connection and device in advance.

If you haven't used Zoom in a while, the app will probably have to update before you can join the meeting. Check your speakers, microphone and camera as well.

- Please keep your microphone muted unless the service offers an opportunity to speak.

Participants should be muted when joining the meeting. Double check. When unmuted everyone can hear what is happening in your surroundings.

- Remember everyone can see your camera view if your camera is on. Be cozy and presentable for public. Let everyone who is moving about your surroundings know that you are online. Others may not want to be on camera.

The world has been heavy lately for a plethora of reasons including situations in our country and the world. Prejudice, meanness and hatred seem to be overcoming kindness, character and basic common sense; and the whole planet is anxious. I am aware of the weight in my own body and spirit, and I have witnessed it in folks all around me. That's why I've asked you to share what is feeding your spirit these dates and giving you hope. - **The 2026 Nominating Committee was elected.**

They are discerning who the Spirit is leading to serve as elders and deacons in the class of 2029 and will present a slate of officer nominees at the congregational meeting on Sunday, March 29th. - **Conversation about UPC Finance's included approval of the pastor's terms of call, discussion of the 2025 final budget figures which will be included in the next prayer update and Q&A about the 2026 budget.**

- **Capital Campaign Report**

Donations will always be received with gratitude for capital concerns! The Capital Campaign ended its active phase at almost 93% of its goal of \$100,000. As of the congregational meeting, \$86,535 has been received with an additional \$6,275 pledged. What an outstanding generous response to the Spirit's call in a campaign that only lasted 3 months in the midst of an uncertain and turbulent economy! Our cups certainly overflow.

From the Capital Campaign Committee:

Thanks to your "over and above" response to our Capital Campaign, we have raised enough money to pay off our loan from 2024 for multiple heating/cooling units; pay off our mortgage; and provide a fund for future capital needs. In fact, when the two remaining old heating/cooling units became dysfunctional in December, we were able to pay for one with the funds we had collected to date.

We would like to make a special mention of UPC's Cub Scout and Boy Scout troops, who made their own contributions to our campaign; and to Beth Kamstrandt, who donated on behalf of Loaves and Fishes, a UPC ministry partner.

We now have enough funds in the Capital Reserve account to enable us to respond to future capital needs. Thank you to all our donors for your generosity. And, remember that you can continue giving to support the Capital Reserve Fund by adding the line "Capital Fund" to your donations!

Session Report

UPC's Session had its regular stated meeting on Monday, January 19th. Session reviewed the new directory and care groups and prayed for the congregation. Session sought the Spirit's discernment of God's will for our faith family as it:

- Heard reports from various ministries;
- Celebrated Laura Pears' hiring as Abraham's Pantry Coordinator,

- Remembered Abraham's Pantry is a community collaboration with UPC as its fiscal agent;
- Approved multiple financial policies including budget, credit card use, stewardship and pledging procedures, and offering counting procedures;
- Approved an inclement weather policy stating church activities including in-person worship are cancelled when Boone County issues a Level 2 Snow Emergency and when the pastor and Session determine cancellation to be the best stewardship of public safety, and
- Closed in prayer for the congregation, community and world.

UPC Session's next meeting is its February stated meeting Monday, February 16th.


