Congregational Meeting & Lunch Sunday, January 29th The meal will be prepared by the Deacons. No need to bring anything but yourself. Nominations will also be accepted from the floor provided that the person nominated has already agreed to serve. The 2023 Officer Nominating Committee will help our congregation discern who the Spirit is leading to serve as Deacons and Elders in the class of 2026.
